


## Where There is a Need, There is a Lion!

1 in 3 California women will experience violence in her lifetime at the hands of her intimate partner. That adds up to 4.5 million victims of domestic violence now living in California. Since 2000, "My Sisters House (MSH)" has provided a safe place and critical services for victims of domestic violence in the greater Sacramento area and in 2016 expanded its program to also help victims of human trafficking. 
