



District 4-C5 Student Speaker Contest

On April 20, 2019, the District 4-C5 Student Speaker Contest was held at the Sacramento County Sheriff's sub-station on 65th Street in Sacramento. Lion members, contest judges, the contestants, and the contestants' families all gathered to listen to each contestant present their own version of the interesting subject, "Freedom of the Press, What Does It Mean?"

The District contest was chaired by Lincoln Hills Lion Dave Evans and called to order by him at 1 pm. There were only three students competing as one of the students did not arrive for the contest.

The contestants were Nikolena Coonen, a Sophomore from Ghidotti College High School, located in Grass Valley sponsored by the Nevada City Lions Club; Rohah Sharma, a Junior from Whitney High School located in Rocklin sponsored by the Rocklin Lions Club; and Jared Parris, a Senior from Antelope High School sponsored by the Antelope Lions Club.

The esteemed Judges were Chuck Edmonds, a retired school principal; Paul Apfel, a retired Lt. Colonel, U.S. Army; Brian Wanzer, a retired Target Store Manager; Earl Evans, a retired Sergeant from the Sacramento Sheriff's Depart-

ment; and John McGinness, a radio talk show personality and former Sheriff, Sacramento County.

As soon as the three contestants concluded their respective speeches the judges filled out the totals on their worksheets. Upon the judge's completion of their worksheets, the time sheets and judges' worksheets were handed to the Tellers, Donner Region Chair Diana Beer and 1st Vice District Governor Sarah Enloe who exited the room to review and verify the scoring completed by each of the judges.

While the two tellers were in an adjoining room reviewing the five score sheets, Lion Dave asked each of the students to introduce themselves, identifying their schools, introducing family members present and identifying their sponsoring Lions Club.

Human Trafficking Community Day of Action-June 9th

Please join the Sacramento Metropolitan Lions Club, National Council of Jewish Women Sacramento Section, International Rescue Committee and WEAVE for our next SacPOST Community Day of Action scheduled for Sunday, June 9, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

SacPOST stands for Sacramento Poster Outreach to Stop Trafficking, a poster outreach campaign based on California Civil Code section 52.6. Under that law, certain categories of establishments must post a notice about human trafficking, as specified in the law. Among other things, the notice must include the phone and text number for the National Human Trafficking Hotline. The notice is an essential way to provide lifesaving services to human trafficking survivors and is an invaluable resource for law enforcement.

Our day of action will begin with a two-hour training on human trafficking, the hotline posting law, outreach strategies and safety. Volunteers will then visit pre-determined business locations in Sacramento County to educate the businesses about human trafficking and the posting law, and to encourage those businesses to post a notice that complies with Civil Code section 52.6 for Sacramento County.

Volunteers will visit locations in teams of 2 or 3 people. This is a great opportunity for each club to form at least one outreach team!



Please help spread the word! The deadline to register is 5 p.m. on Friday, May 17. To register or for more information, please visit http://bit.ly/SacPOST2019.

Please note:

- Participants must be at least 18 years old as of the day of action in order to attend the training and assist with outreach. Participants should not bring anyone with them who is not at least 18 years old.
- The training is FREE; however, participants are committing to serve on an outreach team.
- Participants must pre-register by the registration deadline. We will not be accepting walk-in registrations.




