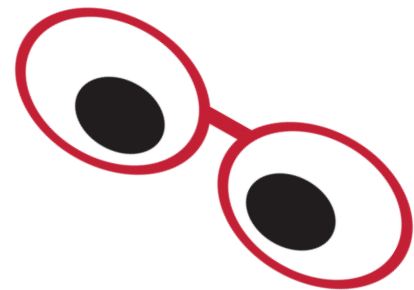

LCI Tax Filing Reminder

Lions: Please remember that all Lions clubs, districts and multiple districts that have annual gross receipts of less than US\$50,000 and do not have to file Forms 990 or 990-EZ must file the e-Postcard (also known as 990-N). If your Lions club, district or multiple district has a foundation, which is a separate legal entity, the appropriate form will need to be filed as well. All filers must register at IRS.gov prior to filing their next Form 990-N. This is a one-time registration if the designated Lion files annually. If the designee changes from a prior year, the new designee must register with the IRS. Please refer to the following chart regarding annual filing requirements:



2018 Tax Year*	Form to File
Gross receipts normally \$50,000 or less	990-N
Gross receipts greater than \$50,000 and less than \$200,000, and total assets less than \$500,000	990-EZ or 990
Gross receipts \$200,000 or greater or total assets \$500,000 or greater	990

The e-Postcard is due by the 15th day of the fifth month after the close of your tax year. Lions clubs operate on a fiscal year, July 1-June 30, and the e-Postcard is due by November 15 each year. Please note that an organization cannot request an extension for filing the Form 990-N.

If you do not file, you risk losing your tax-exempt status. Any Lions club that fails to meet its annual reporting requirement for three consecutive years will automatically lose its tax exempt status. A club may apply for reinstatement of its tax exemption even if it originally fell under a group exemption.

Every club and/or district (single, sub- and multiple) must have an employer identification number (EIN), even if it will not have employees. The EIN is a unique number that identifies the organization to the Internal Revenue Service. To apply for an EIN, you should obtain a Form SS4 and its instructions from the IRS. You may also apply for an EIN online, by telephone (1-800829-4933) or by fax (fax number at the location accepting applications from your state). It is important that clubs and districts use the correct EIN for their annual filing.

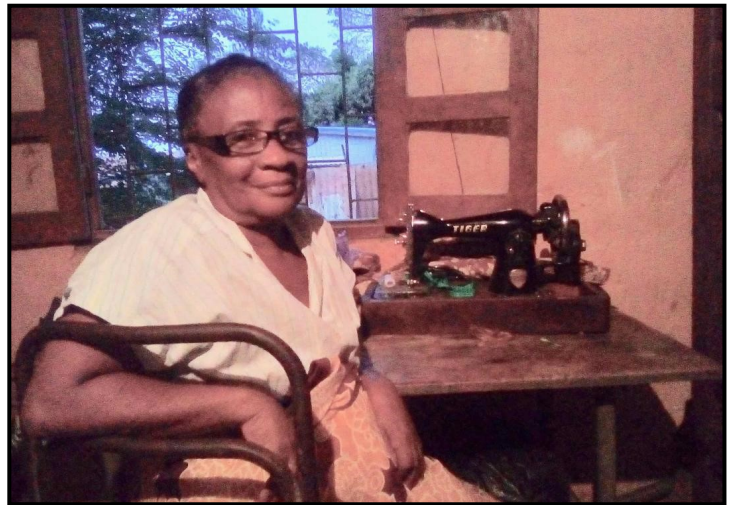
Where There is a Need.....

I would like to inform you that most of the reading glasses are given away, the +2.00 and 2.25, I do not have any more. The +3.25 and +3.50, there are some more left.

Last week I was in a remote area to give them out to the association of women who is doing cooking, weaving and some fishermen in this village. I could not meet all of them because some of them were still busy. I met their representative and trained them about the use and the maintenance of the reading glasses as you instructed me to do. I will be back there in ten days and give the rest of glasses to people who could not get theirs.

I gave out some glasses to teachers as well. They felt deeply indebted to both of you and the Lion's Club of Colfax. Needless to tell that those glasses will be put in good use such as used for reading, making lesson plans and correcting papers.

In a nut shell, all the people who get benefits of your donation are so grateful to the donors and kept telling GOD BLESS THEM, Rozlynn, Russel and the Lion's Club of Colfax. You never imagine how popular you are here in M/car, precisely in Diego-Suarez and its surroundings.

Once again, thank you very much indeed for your help and we hope to have a close collaboration with you in the near future.

Where There is a Need.....

The **Loomis Lions Club** has been a high activity community group since beyond any member's memory. It began in 1953 with more than 40 founding members, all of them business owners, local politicians, farmers and managers of main street businesses. The numbers of members today are in the 50s and growing and the member description about the same. Half of its members hail from the Loomis Basin and half from nearby communities.

One of the reasons this club's recruiting and retentions are one of the best in District 4-C5 is due to strong leadership, great locations for meetings, and many worthwhile projects. Every member is busy and most members volunteer to do more.

Here's a short list of some of our year-long programs which keep us together and involved. They are displayed in no particular order or by level of importance.

The Health Booth – Each year the Town of Loomis, through its Chamber of Commerce, orchestrates the town's Eggplant Festival. This year, as in several recent years, more than 20,000 visitors paid Loomis a day-long visit during that event. Loomis Lions, while teamed with Walgreen Drugs, assembled a 'Health Booth'. Together, Walgreens and Lions provided free flu shots (51), blood pressure exams, and 30 tests for diabetes.



Dinner Nights at the Goose – Loomis Lions make their two fund raising Crab Feeds (February and November) dining nights for locals and for others who come great distances. These two events are posted well in advance so members can plan vacations to be present at their posts. Funds from these public efforts make possible the club's many scholarships, and for giving cash support for

local needs and international crisis.

Christmas Gifts for Families – Each year the club gives working capital to a town grade school for the purpose of gifting help for families of children whom they know are struggling to make ends meet. The two families are told the cash comes from an anonymous donor or donors. The membership takes joy in helping without being identified.

Membership Attraction Campaign – The club recognized years back that recruiting rarely works unless the potential new members are sought in places outside the clubhouse. To make recruiting payoff and fun, the campaigns never end and members go into Town Hall meetings, do some hustling in the crowded crab feeds, and mingle among Chamber of Commerce gatherings. Sometimes they do their selling of the club while in some concoction of a uniform and helmet. It pays to have creative recruiters willing to sell the club at every gathering.

There are more, of course, but these should suffice to make clear we are, indeed, not your ordinary Lions Club.

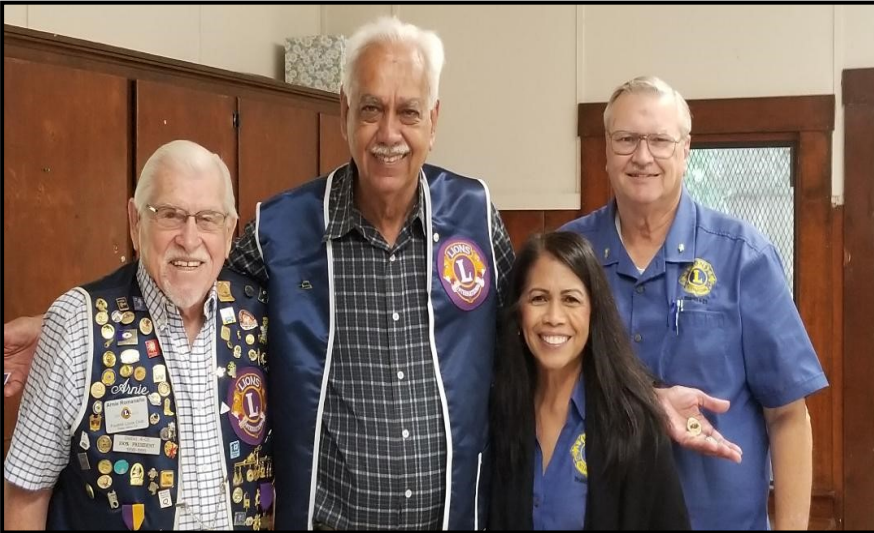

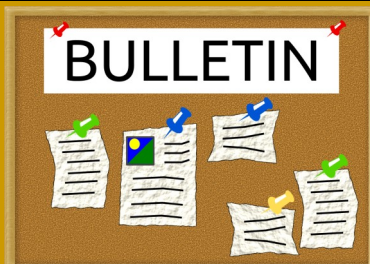
