Dear Lions,

Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the **2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention** to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Although we are disappointed that we won't be able to host this event in person, we are excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We are still finalizing the details of your new convention experience, and will share those with you as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention we'd like to share with you:

- Everyone's invited Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.
- Registration fees The registration fee will be US \$50 until March 31, then US \$75 beginning April 1. The registration fee for Leos will be US\$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.
- **Current registrants** Lions who are currently registered for convention will receive an email soon with more information about their registration options.
- Elections Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.

The Board of Directors are composed of four elected Directors from each of our four Regions, along with our Immediate Past NCLSA President, the current District Governor and our Immediate Past District Governor. Currently, the Association is seeking interested lions to be part of the association becoming a board member. Please submit your name to any board member to be included in the ballot to be voted upon at the District Convention.

The NCLSA meets via Zoom due to Pandemic the first Wednesday of every month at 4 p.m. All Lions are welcome to attend the meetings. The meeting ID and password will be posted as per request. If you are interested in serving on the NCLSA Board, please contact a current Director. Our website is <u>www.nclsa.com</u>. Clubs are encouraged to become a VIP Member and please remember to pay their VIP dues.

**Vision Is Possible (VIP):** This is one of the programs that NCLSA provides to anyone in need of eye surgeries (Cataract, Strabismus, etc.). Director Faye Young presented to the Board a 79 year old patient, S-256, who is in need of bilateral cataract surgery. The Board has approved to shoulder the cost of surgery in the amount of \$650 per eye.

Any VIP club can refer patients to NCLSA if the procedure is beyond the club's financial reach. Please forward your request to Lion Faye Young who will be presenting the patient to the Board of Directors for approval.

Encouraging all Lions clubs to avail of the PlusOptics in your next club activity. If you need training on how to operate the instrument to just let any Board member of NCLSA and they can come to your club to conduct the training.

The NCLSA Board of Directors has approved a matching grant for the UC Davis Eye Center and submitted to LCIF for review and approval during their Board of Directors meeting in May 2021. This is a matching grant from LCIF of \$200,000 for the next two years. NCLSA has committed \$75,000 towards that project, the other \$25,000 will be coming from any club's donation or from other sources.

**Vision Screening Unit:** The Board of NCLSA apologizes for suspending the use of the VSU at this time due to the Pandemic restrictions imposed by the State of California, as a result, NCLSA board has decided to waive the VIP dues for the year 2020-2021 however, if you want to make a donation to NCLSA it is always welcome.

## Lions Education Foundation (LEF)



Lions Education Foundation – Who are we?

Lions Education Foundation (LEF) was founded 31 years ago. We had big plans to

have a celebration during our 30th year, but COVID restrictions prevented some of those plans.

The initial Board was made up of Past District Governor (PDG) Gordon Daniels, Past International President Kay K Fukushima, PDG Carl Burson, Lion Tom Moulton, and PDG Alan Wilson. We are a 501(c) 3 Foundation. We have just under \$20,000 in cash assets that we use for matching grants. When we formed LEF, we needed funds to get it started. So, we reached out to corporations, merchants, and individuals for donations. Once adequate funds were donated and on deposit, we were off and running.

The original purpose of LEF was to help support and raise funds for our Lions Quest Program, so that Lions Quest Workshops could be conducted on a matching grant basis with the support of Lions Clubs International sponsored programs. PDG Gordon Daniels was the first president of the organization; followed by PIP Kay K. Fukushima; and later, PDG Carl E. Burson, Jr.

With the help of others serving on the original Board of Directors, we were able to expand the scope of LEF to include supporting all Youth Activities within District 4-C5 on a Matching Grant basis. As a result, today, our entire annual budget is allocated to youth and education of the youth within our District (not limited to the youth, but it is a main function).

Currently, any matching youth related grant is covered by Clubs sending checks payable to LEF for up to \$500 to obtain a matching grant for a maximum amount of \$1,000 in a fiscal year. Those youth related projects can be in support of a campership; literacy programs; and scholarships, all of which, clubs have participated in the past.

Currently, we have had several matching grants during the last year, with many of them completed as applied for, in spite of COVID restrictions.

How do you apply? You complete the application, which is available on our website. As stated previously, Clubs have supported scholarships; camperships; the literacy program; and several other youth related grant requests.

Once the project has been completed, the Club is required to fill out and submit a simple final report. Clubs must complete projects funded by matching grants before the (your) club can apply for an additional matching grant.

How does LEF maintain their cash balances? Living off of interest was the initial idea. But if anyone, who has been around for a while, knows that interest income is no longer a viable avenue for any reliable income, with some interest earning a few cents per month on large balances.

Our fiscal year begins on July 1<sup>st</sup> of each year. During normal years, we usually hold four major fundraisers, beginning in September with our annual Golf Tournament. This year, we were able to hold our 2020 Golf Tournament in Roseville, with golfers wearing masks and maintaining safe distancing. Raised funds were divided, with a portion going to LEF, and the balance going to Lions Clubs International Foundation.

The next fundraiser was our annual Soup and Salad fundraiser held at Roseville Host Clubhouse at a cost of \$20 per person. This year, it was cancelled due to the COVID restrictions. We look forward to holding that event in January 2022.

The next fundraiser was our annual Pasta Feud, often held at Mother Lode Lions Clubhouse in March of every year, and it too, was cancelled. We hope to resume that event next year or substitute another similar fundraising event.

Our Board is made up of the existing District Governor; Vice District Governors; and our Immediate Submitted by LEF Board member PDG Doug Wight Past District Governor: as well as several Lion members in good standing, that support our youth related activities.

Our matching grants are currently limited to \$1,000 per Club in a fiscal year. If we were to fund every Club in our District during our fiscal year, we would exceed the amount of cash we have on deposit. Therefore, our policy is to fund as many matching grants as possible as they are submitted. It is entirely possible that we could run short if every club applied at the same time. So, if we run out of funds, we would notify all accordingly. Fortunately, with the Clubs not hitting us all at once, we do not have a

fiscal year, in order to increase our funds to fund future matching grants.

## Impact on Eye Sight from Blue Light
