

As of June 30, 2022, I submit the following report on the District actions in reference to LCIF.

Total funds donated to LCIF - \$69,013.85 – DG Donna's goal was \$39,000. **100**% completed

The following is how we stand as a District in completing DG Donna's LCIF goals that she has set for her year:

To be a 100% District in donations – We are at 100%

To be a 100% District in Club-LCIF Coordinators – We have 100% compliance

To have seven clubs become a 100% Club – We are 100%

Folsom Lake LC, Grass Valley Foothill LC, Higgins Diggins LC, Nevada City LC, Woodland Host LC, Woodland Reveille and Woodland Yolo Sunset

To have one club become a 100/100 Club – We are 100%

Folsom Lake LC

To have one club become a Model Club – We are 100%.

Grass Valley Foothill LC

To conduct two District wide fundraising events for LCIF – We are at 100%

This year we held several District, club and individuals fundraisers:

So far, 23 clubs have donated \$17,128.36 to the LCIF Ukraine Relief Fund.

As of the last day of Lion Donna Prince as our Governor, out of 50 clubs, we have added 233 new, reinstated and transferred members to 42 clubs. We lost a total of 170 in 33 clubs, giving us a net growth of **63** for this year!

District 4-C5 would like to welcome **Rio Linda Elverta Country Lions Club**. They were chartered on June 27, 2022 with 25 new members and 6 transfer members for a total of 31 members.

#### PDG Doug's Clam Dip

Submitted by Dee Farmer and Diana Beer

Package Cream Cheese, cubed

Lemon Juice (small amount)

Worchestershire Sauce (a few drops)

Garlic Salt to taste

White Pepper to taste

Sour Cream (about a level teaspoon or less)

Clam Juice (small amount to start)

Minced Clams (one can)

In food processor put cubed chunks of cream cheese, a squeeze of lemon juice (can be plastic squeeze lemon), some drops of Worcestershire sauce, garlic salt, white pepper, about a teaspoon or less of sour cream and a small amount of the clam juice out of a can of minced clams, set the clams aside (I usually drain off the can of minced clams into a measuring cup and set the can of drained clams aside).

Run the food processor until well blended. Always start off with a little of the clam juice and add more after blending if it is too thick. If you put too much of the clam juice in the mix before blending, it's too runny and you wind up having to put another chunk of cream cheese in the mix. Also don't go heavy handed, but limit the addition of seasonings, lemon juice and Worcestershire sauce and clam juice to taste as you blend it. There's no science to the amount of ingredients – rather just taste it as you blend it together.

When it is blended to desired consistency without being runny, add the minced clams. Hit the food processor a few times to meld in the clams without mincing them any further than how they come out of the can. Enjoy sampling while making it! You can always do a double batch with two packages of cream cheese and have leftovers.
