INSIGHTS ALONG THE JOURNEY TO DG



Hello Fellow Lions!

I hope you are all doing well. Isn't this weather something? All the snow and rain at the end February! But then again, it is still winter. I do not remember it being this cold.

The month of February has really been a busy month for me. On February 6, 2023, I flew to Chicago for the First Vice District Governor / District Governor Elect ("FVDG/DGE") Seminar at the Q Center in St. Charles. The seminar was from February 6 through February 9. Then on February 21, I drove to San Jose for the Council of Governors and the MD4 Convention on February 24-27.

I want to share my experience at the FVDG/DGE Seminar. Since August 2022, FVDGs have had virtual interactive trainings/meetings with our Group Leader. My group consisted of FVDGs from the US (including two of my fellow MD4 FVDGs), Philippines, Canada, and Australia. We completed the Preassignments in the booklet, the online training, and prepared a PowerPoint presentation on one of the Global Causes, which would be presented in St. Charles.

When preparing for the in-person seminar in St. Charles, I had no preconceived notions of what it would be like. The first night, we had our first meeting, and it was announced that there were about 755 FVDGs/DGEs from all over the world meeting in one location. This, I thought, was amazing. The Q Center where the seminar took place was an incredible venue. I was told there are 1,000 rooms and the entire building was huge. It seems we were always eating – breakfast, lunch, and dinner were buffets. There



were large selections of several types of food so that everyone could eat according to their dietary requirements. Good thing there was a lot of walking and walking up and down the stairs – this compensated for all the food I ate.

The classroom interactive sessions were interesting, informative, and I learned much. We shared ideas regarding problem solving, team building, membership retention, action planning, and others. We were openminded and worked together cohesively in a mutually respected environment. Isn't that Lionism? We had the opportunity to meet with 1st Vice President Dr. Patti Hill and each of us had a photo with her. We toured LCI's headquarters and met LCI staff. There was excitement, fellowship, and fun.

During our first dinner, there was talk about the earthquake in Turkey. The next day, February 7, it was announced that LCIF provided \$200,000 to Turkey. On Wednesday, during one of the general sessions, a FVDG from Turkey was on the stage and spoke about her country. She said her flight had just left before the devastating earthquake happened. There was also a slide show showing the Lions and Leos managing

Our Group Leader announced making personal donations to LCIF for Turkey. Subsequently, one of the FVDGs at my table challenged all of us to make a donation and if we donated \$5,000, he would jump into the pond. Remember it snows in Chicago and the grounds are covered with snow. The first donation was \$1,000 and the momentum carried throughout the day and the next. By Thursday, the total donations reached over \$10,000. The challenger kept his word and went out to the pond, and while he couldn't jump in, he walked in and laid down on the icy water. We were his cheerleaders. It is amazing what we Lions would and can do to serve.

While we were busy learning to be effective leaders, we also took the time to serve those who are in need the most. I was so impressed with everything that happened during my four-day seminar at the Q-it was truly memorable. I am looking forward to seeing my incredible fellow DGEs in Boston. And I can sincerely say that I am excited and ready to serve as the District Governor in our magnificent District.

As of February 28, 2023, we have added 82 new members to 26 clubs of our District for a 52% increase. We lost a total of 103, giving us a net decrease of 21 for this year. We are closing back on 1,300 in membership. Losses for this year are for Death - 12, Moved - 19, Non-Payment of Dues - 20, Non-Payment or attendance - 3, Good Standing - 45, Transfers - 2, Other - 2.

Our District has the following current make up of members (January 2023):

Total members – 1287

Total Females – 590 (45.8%)

Total Males – 697 (54.2%)

DG Tim's first goal is to have every club increase by 4 members. The clubs that have added 2 or more new members are: Sacramento Camellia +11, Sacramento Capitol and Sacramento Malaya + 10, Davis Aggies +6, Foresthill +5, Elk Grove, Rio Linda and Winters + 4; Roseville Sunrise +3 and Higgins Diggins, Penn Valley, Placerville, Rio Linda Elverta Country, Pride of Laguna Creek and Sacramento Antelope +2.

DG Tim's second membership goal is to have every club that has under 20 in membership increase to over 20 in membership. The following clubs that started off the year under 20 in membership and the information blue/red shows their increase or decrease in membership for this year.

Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) Report

As of February 28, 2023, donations reported on the LCIF Report for District 4-C5 for 2022-2023 total \$26,634.59. This is 68.3% of Governor Tim's goal of \$39,000.

Total number of clubs donated to LCIF: 34 of 50 (68%)

Total number of Zones visited: 7 of 8 (87.5%) Total number of clubs visited: 32 of 50 (64%)

Total number of clubs with a Club LCIF Coordinator: 50 of 50 (100%) Total number of District fundraisers conducted for LCIF: 0 (goal is two)

Total number of 100% Clubs for this year: 0 The following clubs are working on their 100% status: Higgins Diggins, Woodland Host, Woodland Reveille and Woodland Yolo.

This year with the major earthquake in Turkey and Syria, our District has donated as of this date \$16,200 for Disaster Relief. Most of these donations have not been processed by LCIF.

Governor Tim is thinking about having a donation to LCIF to enter the Car Show during the District Convention.

I have sent each Region and Zone Chair a donation report on how their Regions and Zones are doing. We have plenty of time to meet DG Tim's LCIF goal of \$39,000.

I am challenging the remaining 16 clubs to match my \$20 donation to LCIF. This will make us a 100% District for the fifth year in a row. The following clubs have not yet matched my challenge:

Here are some facts about the Lion Project for Canine Companions which was formally founded in 1983.

- Consists of an all-volunteer board of directors and approximately 60 volunteer representatives across the country.
- Project volunteer representative provide presentations to Lions Clubs meetings, district meetings, conventions, and other service organizations to increase public awareness of Canine Companions and gain financial support.
- Your clubs help support the Lion Project through your club membership, Life and Family Life memberships, Distinguished Service Awards, and various sponsorships and fundraisers.
- Currently we have two puppy raisers within our district: Jeri Retzlaff, who also is a breeder caretaker, and myself. We're both available to spread the word about the Lions Project for Canine Companion program.

Proposal 1

Definition of "Good Standing"

Status Quo:

<u>Sec. 1.</u> All clubs in good standing within the District shall have and hold membership in this organization, subject to the Constitution and By-Laws of the International Association of Lions Clubs. A club in good standing is defined as a club which is current with the payment of its per-capita taxes to Lions International and Multiple District Four and with no indebtedness in this District.

Proposed Change:

<u>Sec. 1.</u> All clubs in good standing within the District shall have and hold membership in this organization, subject to the Constitution and By-Laws of the International Association of Lions Clubs. A club in good standing is defined as a club which is current with the payment of its per-capita taxes to Lions International and Multiple District Four and with no indebtedness in this District and all the following, Secretary of State Filing, Franchise Tax Board Filing, Internal Revenue Filing, and Attorney General Filing.

Rationale.

Brings the definition up to date, assists Cabinet Officers ability to enforce same as needed.



Proposal 2

"Librarian"

Status Quo:

Sec. 1. There shall be a Budget and Finance Committee consisting of the Immediate Past Cabinet Treasurer as Chair, the Cabinet Treasurer, the Vice District Governors, the Immediate Past District Governor, the sitting Governor, the Compliance Committee Chair, and two appointed members. Of the appointed members, each shall be a member of a club in a different Region, but no more than one Past District Governor in addition to the Immediate Past District Governor shall serve on the Committee in any fiscal year. The term of office of appointed members shall be two years or until a successor is appointed. No member shall be appointed to succeed him/herself in the next consecutive term except in instances when the committee member has been appointed to serve for the last six months or less of an unexpired term. The incumbent District Governor's Cabinet shall fill interim vacancies and, before the end of its tenure, appoint a new member to the Committee for the two ensuing years from the Region with the lowest representation at the time of appointment.

Proposal:

Sec. 1. There shall be a Budget and Finance Committee consisting of the Immediate Past Cabinet Treasurer as Chair, the Cabinet Treasurer, the Vice District Governors, the Immediate Past District Governor, the sitting Governor, the Committee Chair, The Committee Librarian, and two appointed members. Of the appointed members, each shall be a member of a club in a different Region, but no more than one Past District Governor in addition to the Immediate Past District Governor shall serve on the Committee in any fiscal year. The term of office of appointed members shall be two years or until a successor is appointed. No member shall be appointed to succeed him/herself in the next consecutive term except in instances when the committee member has been appointed to serve for the last six months or less of an unexpired term. The incumbent District Governor's Cabinet shall fill interim vacancies and, before the end of its tenure, appoint a new member to the Committee for the two ensuing years from the Region with the lowest representation at the time of appointment.

A description of the Librarian position should appear in the By-Laws

Rationale.

Appoints a specific position dedicated to the preservation of financial records thus allowing for greater detail in preparing Budgets and insuring Districts Financial "Health".

Financial Impact.

Although there is no direct cost of implementing this proposal the information collected is vital to the financial management of the District and may also be helpful in avoiding any unnecessary dues increases.
