We are the host Multiple District, MD-4 (all of California), and we still need lots of volunteers to meet and greet our Lions visitors attending from our other states and Canada! There are volunteer opportunities to direct our guests to sessions and meals, work in the Forum store, or work in the office. Last month, I introduced you to the Leadership Forums and showed you how they can help you to become a more knowledgeable Lion and how to really make the most of the great opportunities they provide. Lions University is an online program developed and administered by the USA/ Canada Leadership Forum.



There are three levels of accomplishment in Lions University- bachelors, masters, and doctorate. Each level of accomplishment has its own program and goals. Last month I talked about the bachelor's program. This month, I'll talk about the second level, the master's program.

The master's program is intended to educate and give guidance to the Lions serving at the District Level-District Governors, Vice District Governors, Zone and Region Chairs, District Committee Chairs, and other leaders. Of course, you don't have to be in any of those positions to learn and gain knowledge from these courses!

The requirements to fulfill the master's program are 10 required courses and 5 elective courses. Each of these courses takes approximately 1 hour and is mostly watching YouTube videos presented by the faculty. To sign up for Lions University, go to www.Lionsuniversity.org. 3 Once you complete the 10 required courses and your 5 electives, you can apply for your master's on the website. If you have already received your bachelor's certification then when you attend the USA/Canada Leadership Forum in Reno, you will receive your master's from our incoming Lions Clubs International President, Dr. Patti Hill!

I am currently taking the courses and am learning a lot! I encourage you to join me in signing up for Lions University and attend the USA/Canada Forum in Reno in September! Happy Summer!

NEWS FROM LIONS CLUB OF RIO LINDA



Many would say it is the trees that reflect the county's heritage of a Grass Valley covered in trees located in the Sierra Nevada Foothills. Most folks that visit the Nevada County Fairgrounds refer to it as the most beautiful fairgrounds in California.

Over the last year, the Fairgrounds experienced a beetle infestation and severe weather that resulted in the loss of 90 trees this last winter. Gold Country Lions stepped up this year by donating seven large coastal redwood trees to help fulfill the Lions MD-4 California Project Cares April Earth Day service challenge. The goal of the fairgrounds staff was to plant these in areas of the fair where mostly ponderosa pines were lost.

Gold Country Lions, who operates the Carmel Corn Booth on Treat Street, used proceeds from making and selling Carmel Corn to help the Nevada County Fairgrounds restore its beauty with some tree replacements. When you purchase the golden caramel corn, you also help the environment with tree replacement. This is the second tree donation event by Gold Country Lions, and it won't be the last.


