#### INSIGHTS ALONG THE JOURNEY TO DG

*"SO YOU WANT TO BE A ZONE CHAIR?"* That was going to be the subject of our workshop at the November District Cabinet meeting. 2<sup>nd</sup> VDG Brent Showalter and I were looking forward to presenting that topic, but ultimately we couldn't because there are so many other great topics to explore. Instead, I thought I would write a little bit about it now - the benefits, requirements, and expectations for Zone Chairs. I hope you enjoy it, and if you have any questions or are interested in becoming a Zone Chair, Region Chair, Coordinator, or any other District Cabinet position please feel free to email me at Lionvictoriabrady@gmail.com or call or text me at (916) 439-6487. I'd love to hear from you!

#### There are many benefits to being a Zone Chair!

First, being a Zone Chair is fun! I really enjoyed myself the year I was Zone Chair. It was the first time I met a lot of Lions outside of my club and I made some good friends that year. It also really develops your organizational and leadership skills and helped me to understand the structure of the

district. I learned a lot about the Lions organization, and gained important mentors who guided and helped me. As a Zone Chair, you will also become a mentor to the Club Presidents and Officers, whom you will guide and help in return. And the Zone Chair position is a required one by LCI. It's an extremely important and necessary position. There are eight Zones in our District MD4C5, with two Zones assigned under each of the four Regions.

Next, the requirements of Zone Chair are: You must have served or will have served at the time of taking office as club President for a full term (or major portion), and as a member of the club board of directors for no less than two years. In addition, you can only serve as a Zone Chair for 3 years during your Lions career.











Finally, the duties of the position are to be Chair of the District Governor's Advisory Committee. The other members of the committee are the President, Vice-Presidents, and Secretaries of the clubs in your Zone. You should be prepared to attend District Governor visitation meetings in your zone, three District cabinet meetings, and hold Zone meetings before the cabinet meetings. A great idea is to hold a joint Zone meeting! This year, Zone Chairs Peggy Kwong (Crocker Zone) and Murray Navarro (Sutter Zone), with their Region Chair Eddie Aducayen (Sacramento Region), have been holding their Zone meetings together. Everyone has been enjoying coming together to learn and share success stories and help each other while eating lots of yummy food.

There are many resources to help you through your Zone Chair year. First, of course, is your Region Chair, District Governor, other Zone Chairs and Cabinet. You will be working closely with them. Second, there will be Zone Chair training and Lions International has many resources, including the Zone Chair manual, planning calendar and PowerPoint presentations. In addition, each Zone meeting already has an assigned topic for you, so you don't need to worry about what to talk about. In my Zone meetings, most of the agenda was dedicated to listening to the club President and officers talk about



their completed and upcoming projects and that was always exciting and fun. As my mentor, Region Chair Mark Steffens, said he wished he'd stayed for one more year as Zone Chair because by the time you have everything figured out, the year is over! And both he and I really enjoyed our stints as Zone Chairs for the Crocker Zone.

So, I hope I have given you some ideas and encouragement to see how vital and important the Zone Chair position is. I appreciate every Lion who has served in this position, and hope that you aspire to serve (or re-serve!) as a Zone Chair at some time during your Lions career. # **NCLSA UPDATE**

Northern California Lions Sight Association, Inc. (NCLSA) is a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation which provides assistance to local communities in providing vision related service to residents within the District 4-C5 area through medical services, education, and through the use of its Sight Van as well as its many Plus Optics Vision Screening units.

NCLSA owns a Sight Van fully equipped with Vision Screening equipment which can be used in medical fairs where people can take advantage of free vision screening to look for signs of eye diseases such as Glaucoma or vision corrections. Lions Clubs located within the 4-C5 region can reserve the van so it can be used as part of their community outreach projects. Once reserved, NCLSA will provide the driver along with the van and the Lion Club reserving will need to provide the optometrists.

NCLSA also works with VSP through 4-C5's Folsom Project where VSP provides us a supply of certificates which can cover most of the cost of getting a pair of glasses. These certificates have helped a tremendous amount of people who are experiencing financial difficulties

NCLSA is also now working with its partner Plus Optics to help develop a process to make it easier to do vision screening for kids with Down Syndrome.

Currently, NCLSA also has an opening for 2 more directors so any Lion in good standing within the 4-C5 district can join the wonderful team of this organization. Currently the fees to use the Sight Van are being waved but please confirm with Joe if that is still the case. Do not hesitate to reserve the van since the calendar can fill up fast at certain times of the year. VIP clubs may reserve the unit 12 months in advance.

On Saturday October 7, 2023, The California Lions Native Plants Garden at the Woodland Boy Scout Cabin was dedicated during Woodland's Stroll Through History. Woodland Host Lions obtained a \$1,000 grant from the California Lions Foundation from the CLF environmental grant program. The Garden was installed by members of Woodland Host Lions, Scouts from Troops 69 (Woodland), 139 (Davis), and 152 (Dixon), and scout parents. In addition to enhancing the environment around the Boy Scout Cabin, the native plants garden will help the scouts fulfill one of their advancement requirements – be able to identify 10 native plants.

In addition, a valley oak donated by the Woodland Tree Foundation was planted to complement the existing redwood. When the Trees mature, they will provide some much-needed shade in the back of the Scout Cabin.
