

As of March 31, 2024, we have added 115 new, transferred and reinstated members to 31 clubs for a 63.3% increase; we lost a total of 86, giving us a net growth of +29 so far this year. Total membership is 1397.

Loses for this year are for Death -17, Moved -5, Non-Payment of Dues -11, Non-Payment or attendance -6, Non-attendance -13, Good Standing -24, Transfers -3, Other -7

Our District is 47% female and 53% male.

Clubs on the move: Sacramento BeauVita Lions Club has added 14 new members.

Sacramento Valley-Hi Lions Club has added 13 new members. Sacramento Mabuhay Lions Club has added 9 new members.

Higgins Diggins Lions Club has added 6 new members.

Clubs under 20 in membership (Delta Lions, Folsom Lake Lions, Placerville Lions and Valley Hi Lions) have all increased in membership.

16 of 49 (32.7%) Clubs have been visited about Membership either by the GMT 31 of 49 (63.3%) Clubs have inducted a new, reinstated or transfer member 8 of 8 (100%) Zones have been visited about the Membership

The 3rd Quarter CA Cares initiative continued through March with service focused on Youth and Vision. Any club participating in the Student Speaker Contest will automatically be able to enter a Youth activity in MyLion for CA Cares. It can be difficult determining via MyLion if a project or donation has something to do with Vision or Youth. Numerous hours have been spent in an attempt to be accurate. It would definitely help if club secretaries entered information using the phrases "vision" or "youth." Our final quarter focus will be "Environment".

Most of our clubs continue to enter Monthly Membership Reports in MyLCI. Thank you to Lion Jeri Retzlaff for assisting in entering club reports. Lions Clubs International is transitioning to the new member portal. Secretaries have been encouraged to enter MMR's, new officers, and MyLion information by April 11, 2024.

25 clubs entered information regarding 248 service activities in March, improving the lives of almost 17,000 people in their communities. Activities included feeding, literacy, environment via cleanups, vision via glasses collections and eye screening, Easter events, preparation for High School graduation, and more. Numerous clubs have completed their Student Speaker contests, and have gone on to zone contests.

Year to date through March 2024 statistics are:

Clubs reporting: 100% People Served: 238,200+ Service Activities Completed: 2,628 Volunteer Hours: 64,000 Funds Donated: \$253,000+ Funds Raised: \$712,600+

A large amount of money has been raised from our communities – hopefully we will all be "broke" by June 2024!

Club Presidents, it is now that time of the year where you start thinking about presenting a Melvin Jones Fellowship to a member of your Club or Community. Each club has its own way of selecting a member to receive this honor.

Some clubs present the Melvin Jones Fellowship to their outgoing Club President for outstanding leadership and direction for the club. Some clubs present this honor to their oldest tenured member. Some clubs present this honor to a member for their outstanding service as a chair of an event: service project or a fundraiser for LCIF. There are many reasons why a club would select a member to receive this honor.

The donation for this honor is \$1,000 in support of all of the projects and programs that LCIF supports. Your support enables LCIF and Lions around the world to continue their humanitarian service in the areas of blindness prevention, youth education and development, help to the disabled and disaster relief. The clubs' generosity and donation to LCIF may help provide sight-saving cataract surgeries, teach children life skills through the Reading program or re-build homes following a natural disaster.

Several of the clubs already have funds in the Club's Unnamed Account. To find out if your club has any funds, please contact your District LCIF Coordinators PDG Andy Anderson or Lion Natalee Price. If you have any funds in this account, all you would need to do is to donate the remaining amount in order to present a Melvin Jones Fellowship.

Club Presidents and Club Board of Directors this is the highest honor that you can give one of your members. It can take the LCIF department up too four to six weeks to process a Melvin Jones Fellowship request and have it sent to you.

So please put this on your Club's Board of Director's Meeting Agenda and discuss this with your members. Again if you have any questions please contact your District LCIF Coordinators PDG Andy Anderson or Lion Natalee Price.





As we anticipate the spring weather and the changes it brings, plans continue to move forward on Louisville. One of things highlighted in this newsletter is the Lions Speed Learning. This was a new idea implemented by last year's General Chair Jama Wahl. When it was added to the agenda, we had no idea how it would be received. It was a great success and we had standing room only for last year's event. We anticipate this year's turnout will be just as great, but don't worry. We will be in a larger space and be able to accommodate all who want to attend.



The education committee is working hard and as of my last conversation with them, there are 100 seminars on the tentative schedule. Now becomes the process of recruiting moderators and facilitators for each of those sessions.

We are also working hard to recruit as many exhibitors as possible for the event. Exhibitor Chair Yves Léveillé is talking to Lions and vendors from all over and he is trying to hit a lofty goal.


California Lions Pin Traders Association ("CLPTA")

Purpose: To encourage friendship and the exchange of ideas among Lion and LEO Clubs.

Visitation Protocol:

- Contact the club president or secretary well in advance of planning a club visit to verify if the visit is convenient for them. After coordinating with your club members, contact the same club officer at least three (3) days in advance of the visit, advising them of the number attending.
- Verify the meeting time and location, as changes do occur.

In-person or Zoom visits count.

- The stealing of the bell or gavel is symbolic; no items may be taken from the premises by the visiting club. If a club has their bell or gavel "stolen" they may not use it until they visit the other club.
- Awards will be given for both Club and Individual visitation. Awards for 1st and 2nd place will be presented at
 the District Governor's Appreciation Event to the clubs with the greatest number of Official Visits to other Lion
 and LEO Clubs during the contest period.
- Definition of an Official Club Visit: The greater number of three (3) club members or 10% of the total membership reported on the June Monthly Membership Report must be present for the majority of the Club visit.

Only one visit to any club in the same month may be counted. All visits must be reported on MyLion.

- Club meetings, fundraisers or service projects qualify as an Official Visit. In addition, participating clubs may
 count their attendance at ONE Zone OR Region Meeting. However, any of the clubs present must have the
 greater of 3 members or 10% of membership at the Zone or Region Meeting to be counted for contest purposes.
- The club visitation chair, secretary, president, or other assigned administrator of the club must submit the completed list of clubs visited, dates of visits, and the names of Lions attending each visit to the contest chair by June 5, 2024.
- Individual visitation records must include the club visited, date of visit and be verified with the signature of the Club Visitation Chair, Secretary or other Club Administrator. Submissions must be in the hands of the Contest Chair by June 5, 2024

<u>ROUND TAIL AWARD</u> – Nine (9) visits to Lions or LEO clubs in the Zone or Region, with no club visited more than twice.

<u>SHORT TAIL AWARD</u> – Thirteen (13) visits to any Lions or LEO clubs in the District. Only one visit to any club is allowed.

<u>LONG TAIL AWARD</u> – Forty (40) visits to different Lions or LEO clubs in the District; however, every club in the Region must be visited. Up to ten (10) visits to other Districts may be counted.

<u>ROAMIN' LION AWARD</u> – Fifteen (15) visits to different Lions or LEO clubs outside of District 4-C5 within a three -year period.


Carl E. Burson, Jr. Legacy Award





Collection and recycling of CLEAN poly-film, from such as store-bought plastic bags, beverage case wrappers like those around water, soda, etc., packing material such as air pillows, and other plastic wraps, will be our district environment project to qualify for a free TREX-manufactured bench.

Here's how you can participate:

- Collect the above materials and estimate the weight of your clean, collected, plastic film and wraps and make a note of it.
- 2. Your club can select one person to collect all the amounts from each club member. That coordinator can then E-mail or call your zone chair with the total amount of weight of the collected plastic film for that month. Your zone chair will collect and combine all the weights from all the clubs within their zone to provide to the region chair and then the environment project chair. All weights will be combined under the District Governor Zenny's account with TREX for credit towards the bench. Note that after confirmation with TREX, we are only eligible for one bench.
- 3. When ready to turn them in, visit one of the following retail stores:
 - a. Home Depot or Lowe's
 - b. Target or Walmart
 - c. Your local grocery store, such as Safeway, Raley's, Bel Air, or Nugget
- 4. Deposit your bags in the storefront recycling container or if you have a lot, make sure to call ahead of time so that someone can assist you with bringing your recyclable plastic film to their larger collection container typically in the back of the store.
