

Adopt-A-Vision

Provides funding for eye exams and prescription eyeglasses to individuals in need, helping them see clearly and live fully



Mobile Vision Screening Van

We employ advanced diagnostics for conditions like glaucoma, macular degeneration, and diabetic retinopathy



Vision Is Possible Program

Financial support for eye surgeries and advanced treatment when local Lions Club resources are not enough.



Trust-Fund Awards

Endowment-based grants that help cover high-cost eye care procedures for underserved individuals.



Folsom Project for the Visually Impaired

Inmates in Folsom State Prison transcribe books into Braille, audiobooks, closed-caption video services, and repair eyeglasses to support those who are blind or have visual learning disabilities.
